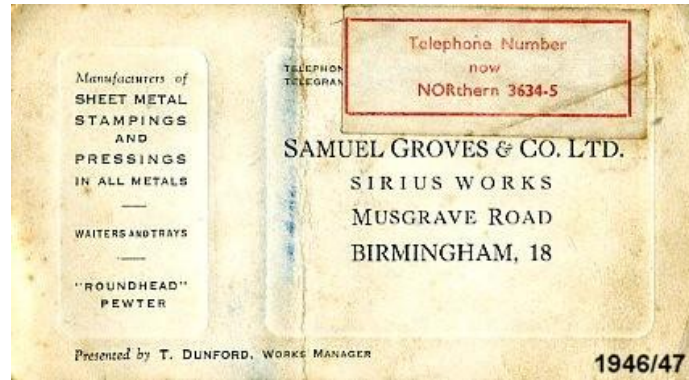


The Two - SAMUEL GROVES - FROM 1799 TO 1893 and their Cannon

BREECH-LOADING CANNON To the Editor of the DAILY POST.

Sir,- In the year 1849 I, Samuel Groves, living at that time at No.89 Digbeth, Birmingham, conceived the idea of a "liquid-fire shell," of which I made a communication to Robert Martineau, Esq., Mayor of Birmingham, who gave me a letter to William Scholefield, Esq., M.P., for the same borough. Through this gentleman I laid my models and explanations before the Select Committee of Officers of the Royal Artillery at Woolwich, who gave me an order for twelve shells or bombs of certain calibre, and promised to fire them by way of test, which they performed in March, 1850, but with effect or remuneration, under the superintendence of Lieutenant-Colonel J.U. Chalmer, R.A., their Secretary. This officer said, "If you should have any other invention which you would wish to bring before the Select Committee, and you will entrust it to my care, I will bring it before them and report upon it to the Master General of Ordnance and yourself, to save you the expenses, as you, being a working man, can ill afford them."

While at Woolwich I saw men exercising upon large cannons. I there also conceived the idea of the breech-loading cannon; subsequently I made the model and sent it to Lieutenant-Colonel Chalmer, Select Committee Office, Woolwich, where it remained during six weeks, and was returned to me without comment.

This brass model remained in my possession till January, 1854, when a Mr. William Henry Bentley, from Bedford, came to lodge at my house, No. 55, Hill Street, Birmingham, on who seeing the model, said, "I give you credit for what you have done ; but what a pity to let it lie idle. Why not bring it out?" I told him what had been done for that end, and that, having spent much money and time upon it, I did not then feel disposed to spend more; he replied, "If I would let him take it to London, he could, through the influences of the Duke of Bedford and the Earl de Grey, bring it out so as the Government, no doubt would adopt it." On this assurance I agreed to let him take the model, and to do the best he could with it, on condition that I bore no expense ; but should anything turn to my advantage *that he would be rewarded according to merit.*

He took the brass model Cannon and in a few days wrote to me for a second, with certain improvements. Accordingly a second one was made, and sent, by his instructions, to the station-master of Euston Square Station, London, for William Henry Bentley. I have not seen my models since then, but I find that the said W. H. Bentley, of Bedford, in the county of Bedford, patented, in 1855, the following year, a breech-loading cannon, with projectiles thereto ; and that the said Mr.

Bentley is at this moment soliciting sympathy in Birmingham, to enable him to prove that both Mr. William Armstrong and Mr. Whitworth, of Manchester, have stolen his invention, infringed his patent, and have gotten the honours and rewards that, solely and by right, belong only to himself. My object, Sir, in writing this is to put the public right as to the facts of the case, which I *solemnly* declare are true and candid. The insertion of our cause will oblige,
