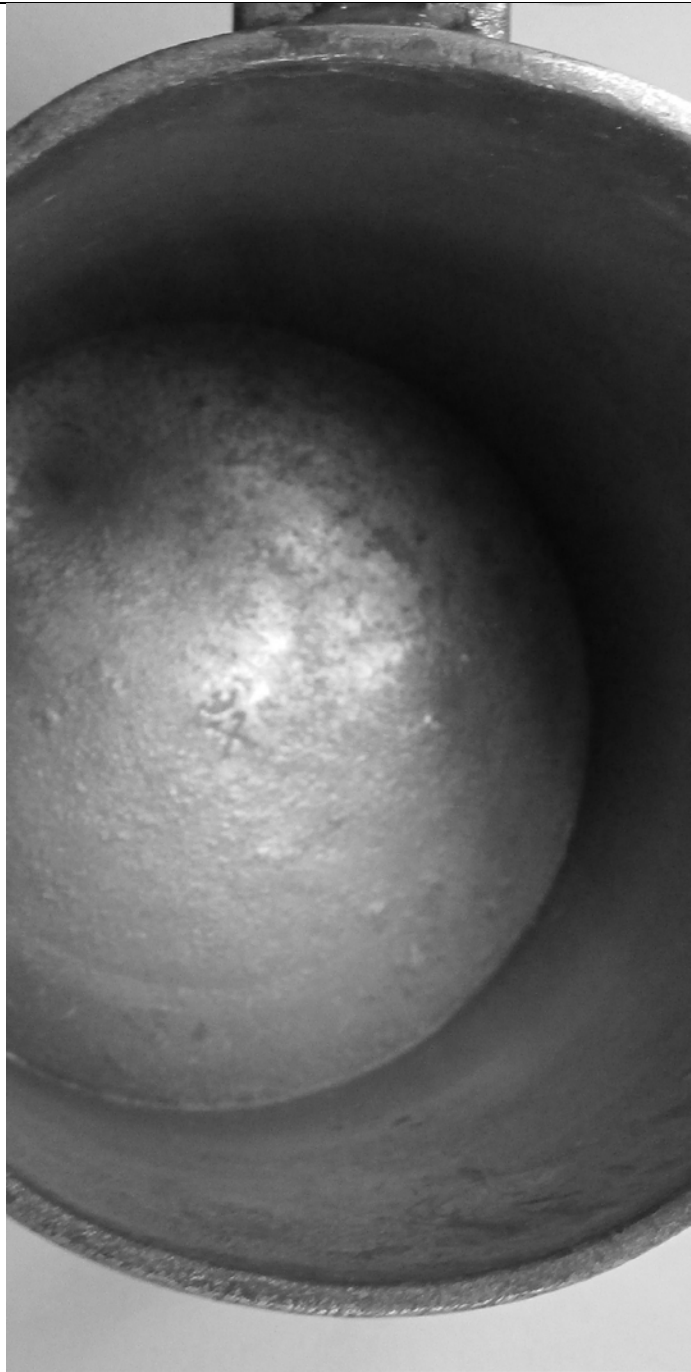

- Early and Rare Pewter Antique York Mug – capacity 1 ½ wine pints about 27 fl ozs. Made in about 1760 and unmarked. A small solder repair of some age under the base and a nick to the lip rim, otherwise excellent condition and patina. Identical to that illustrated in The Records Of The York Company of Pewterers on page 44 fig 16, 5 ½” high top rim 3 ½” footrim 4 ¾” weighs 1 lb 6 ozs.

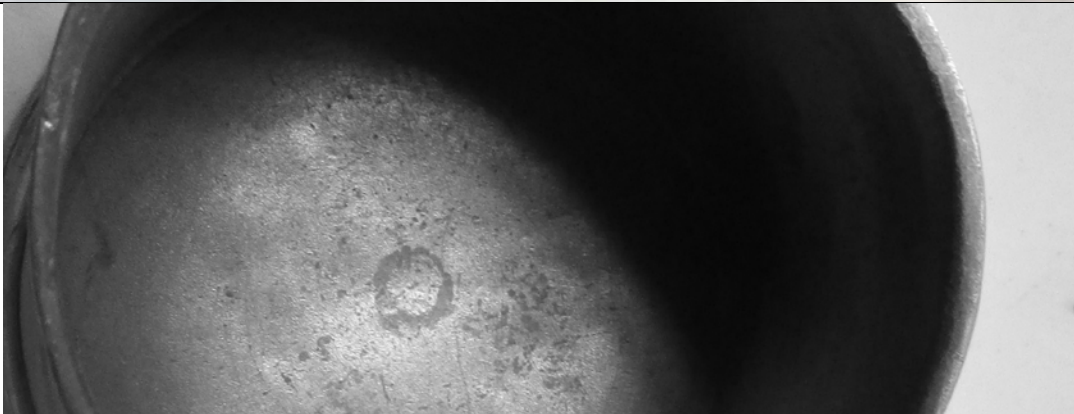

Rare Antique Pewter Ale Half-Pint Yorkshire Mug, nicely marked. .
Distinctive Yorkshire handle made in York or Leeds in about 1770 1780 with simple body fillet. (ex David Hall collection and illustrated page 44 fig 15 of The Records Of The York Company of Pewterers. Large crowned early WR verification mark also Rose over YWR over 15 – ie division 15 of West Riding. 1/2Pint capacity mark is an early mark made with individual letter dies. Diameters top rim 2 ¾” footrim 3 ¼” stands 3 5/8” and weighs over 10 ozs.

York Acorn by a John Harrison 1730-1750

Research has shown that there are only about 36 of this type of flagon still surviving and this is a good example. Furthermore just 6 of these bear the touch of John Harrison of York which includes this flagon with the clear 'IH' touch under a crowned X struck under the base.

It has a classic ram's horn thumbpiece and ridged spade handle terminal. The handle is hollow, which is a later feature than solid strap handles, thus dating this flagon to c1730-1750.

Measuring 13 inches to the top of the thumbpiece and containing 120 fluid ounces or six Ale Standard pints it is much the same size as the others recorded by Harrison and probably is from the same moulds.

This is from the Jane Russell Collection and is in overall good condition with a dark, even surface. It has had a more appropriate style of knob attached to replace the previous overlarge replacement one and a small split in the foot rim has been repaired.
